<p>In FY 15-16, consistent with all MRP Permittees, all public K-12 schools, college and university parcels were made non-jurisdictional on the City's baseline trash generation maps. Under California Government Code Sections 4450 through 4461, the construction, modification, or alternation of facilities and/or structures on these parcels are under the jurisdiction of the California Division of State Architect and not the City. The public right-of-way (e.g., streets and sidewalks) surrounding these parcels remain as jurisdictional on the City's baseline trash generation maps. Revised maps that incorporate these revisions were included as Appendix 10-2 to the City's FY 2015-2016 Annual Report.</p> <p>Furthermore, it should be noted that businesses in TMA 3B (Charter Square Shopping Center) had been closed since FY 2017-18 as the current site is being developed to be a new elementary school within the San Mateo-Foster City School District. The new school is anticipated to start in FY 2020-21.</p>	<p>All Applicable</p>
