Pesticide Application Inspection ~ PPE

What is required by regulation? ~ CCR 6738



WARNING

OR

DANGER





- Closely woven fabric
- Covers the entire body except head, hands, and feet
- Provided by the employer as PPE

What is required by label? ~ FAC 12973

- Long Sleeved Shirt
- Long Pants
- Shoes with Socks
- Different requirements for mix/load and application?







How to Choose Gloves

Gloves for Handling Pesticides

Due to PPE shortage during the current COVID-19 crisis, DPR has compiled some glove-safety tips.

If you use reusable gloves, they must be the same material as label-required disposable gloves.

Chemical resistant gloves must be <u>at least</u> 14 mil thick[†], so substitute for thicker gloves of the same material.

† except laminate and polyethylene gloves



Caring for Reusable Gloves

- Inspect your gloves before putting them on. Never wear damaged chemical resistant gloves!
- Wash your hands with soap and water before you put them on.
- Wear your gloves as required by label or regulation when performing handler tasks.
- Wash your gloved hands with soap and water before removing gloves.
- Dry and store your clean gloves away from pesticides, in a cool dry place, and away from direct sunlight.
- After removing gloves, wash your hands with soap and water.

Do not touch contaminated gloves with bare hands!



Safety Rules for Pesticide Handlers in Non-Agricultural Settings

The pesticide label, your training, and the Pesticide Safety Information Series (PSIS) leaflets tell you about pesticide dangers at work. You must be at least 18 years old to mix or load a pesticide that requires an air-supplied respirator, a closed system or full-body chemical-resistant clothing.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE

Your employer must make plans for emergency medical care before you start working with pesticides. If you think that pesticides made you sick or hurt you at work, immediately tell your employer. They must make sure that you are taken to a doctor right away. DO NOT TAKE YOURSELF

If more space is needed to list medical facilities, your employer may attach a list to this leaflet and write, "See attached list" in the above space.

REMEMBER: You DO NOT have to pay for medical care if you get sick or hurt from pesticides at work.

Fill in the blank lines in this leaflet and display a copy of this handout at a central location in the workplace (such as an employee break room). If requested, you must read this leaflet to an employee in a language the employee understands.

- If Exposed Employer Must Provide Immediate Transportation to Facility
- Employer Must Provide Product Names, SDSs, EPA Reg. #s, Active Ingredients, Exposure Details

THE EMPLOYER SHALL MAKE **PRIOR** ARRANGEMENTS FOR <u>EMERGENCY</u> <u>MEDICAL CARE</u> FOR ALL EMPLOYEES HANDLING PESTICIDES AND SHALL <u>POST</u> IN A PROMINENT PLACE AT THE WORK SITE THE NAME, ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE PHYSICIAN, CLINIC OR HOSPITAL EMERGENCY ROOM PROVIDING CARE.

Safe Equipment ~ CCR 6742

- All Equipment Used by Employees to Apply or Mix and Load Any Pesticides
- Good Repair & Safe to Use
- No Leaks
- Clean Nozzles



Protection of Persons/Animals/Property ~ CCR 6614



- Are there people or animals present?
- Are bees actively foraging?
- Is it windy?
- Is it raining?

Decontamination Facility ~ CCR 6734 WARNING OR DANGER PESTICIDES

- Within 100 feet of the mixing and loading site:
 - Sufficient water
 - Sufficient soap
 - Sufficient single use towels
 - One clean change of coveralls at each

decontamination site










What Does Sufficient Water Mean?

- 3 Gallons per Handler
- Running Tap within100 Feet

Kept separate from personal clothing



 Clean and Pesticide-free, Specifically Designated Place



Proper Pesticide Transport ~ CCR 6682

Pesticides Shall Not Be Transported in Compartment with Persons, Feed, or Food




DPR Business Licensing: MG vs. AgPCB

Landscape Businesses Contracted by Municipalities:

MUST BE LICENSED as AGPCB

in order to
Perform Pest Control in
Rights-of-Way, Parks, Golf Courses,
Cemeteries, and Nurseries



AgPCB License Categories

B: Landscape ~

LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE: Control of pests in natural or planted ornamental and turf landscape areas and outside areas around buildings. Includes orchards, vacant lots, greenbelts, cemeter, s, landscaped street medians, parking lots directly related to landscape areas, landscaped areas in enclosed shopping malls and indoor plants.


C: Right-of-Way~

RIGHT-OF-WAY: Control of pests in the maintenance of landscaped right-of-way areas, roads, highways, power lines, telephone lines, pipelines, canals, railroads or other similar sites.

Most Common Violations

1. PPE
2. Emergency Medical Care
3. Service Container Labeling
4. Registered Label
