





## **SMCWPPP** version of Annual Report form does not include the following provisions

- <u>Provision C.8</u> Water Quality Monitoring is reported on separately by Countywide Program.
- <u>Provision C.14</u> Bacterial Controls for Impaired Waters is not applicable to San Mateo County Permittees, with exception of City of San Mateo. The City of San Mateo should use the BAMSC Annual Report form for this section.
- <u>Provision C.16</u> Discharges to Areas of Special Biological Significance is only applicable to the County of San Mateo. However, this provision does not include Annual Reporting requirements. The County of San Mateo should fulfill other reporting requirements in Provision C.16.
- <u>Provision C.18</u> Control of Sediment Discharges from Coastal San Mateo County Roads is only applicable to the County of San Mateo. The County of San Mateo should use the BAMSC Annual Report form for this section.
- <u>Provision C.19</u> Cities of Antioch, Brentwood, and Oakley, Unincorporated Contra Costa County, and the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Requirements is not applicable to San Mateo County Permittees.
- Provision C.20 Cost Reporting requirements for Annual Reporting begin with the September 2025 Annual Report.
- <u>Provision C.21</u> Asset Management requirements for Annual Reporting begin with the September 2025 Annual Report.

- SM County Permittees to provide their draft Annual Reports to EOA for review
- Draft Countywide Program Annual Report emailed to SM County Permittees for review
- o Permittees provide List of Newly Installed Stormwater Treatment Systems (Table C.3.h.v.(2)) to SMCWPPP staff

### Sept 15

- EOA to provide comments to SM County Permittees on their draft Annual Reports
- Permittees to provide comments to EOA on draft Countywide Program Annual Report

### Sept 22

- Permittee final Annual Reports to be completed by this date
- o Final SMCWPPP Annual Report provided to Permittees for uploading via SMARTs along with Permittee Annual Reports

### Sept 29

o Target date to certify and submit final Countywide Program and Permittee Annual Reports via SMARTS to the Water Board

## **SMARTS**

- Permittees should upload and certify an electronic copy of their FY 2022/23 Annual Report (PDF format) using SMARTS by September 29, 2023
- Step-by-step instructions: Water Board staff guidance document "Permittee Guide to Annual Report Submission in SMARTS" (dated July 14, 2021)
- Review SMARTS records well in advance to verify designated staff and update as needed
  - Legally Responsible Person (LRP)
  - Duly Authorized Representative (DAR)
  - Data Entry Person (DEP)
- Each Permittee is required to upload the Countywide Program Annual Report along with its own Annual Report
